FROM SOL TO OCEAN: MARIAH MACIAS

In 2014, after communication from Sara Winchester, Executive Vice President of Finance and Administration, regarding an opportunity to apply for a grant from Santander Universities, a winning proposal was submitted, and the College awarded a three-year, \$150K grant to support Lakewood High School students.

Mariah enrolled in our 2016 recruitment cohort. The rigorous recruitment process was designed to identify those students most able to commit to and complete the program. Applicants were required to attend all activities to be accepted. Mariah went to the information session, applied, attended orientation, participated in College Experience Day, and earned a seat in the on-site (Lakewood High School) Student Success course.

Mariah shared she applied to SOL because, I hadn't done the best of my ability in high school. I heard about SOL from a teacher and felt it was the perfect opportunity to get ahead and really redeem myself. While Mariah did not successfully pass Student valuable Success, she learned lessons. Unfortunately, I did not utilize my support system. Looking back, I realize there are people who I could have talked to and more than likely received help. Self-doubt and anxiety led to depression. I ultimately made the decision to give up, a decision I would later regret.

The years passed. Mariah worked jobs in retail, food service, and earned her Certified Home Health Aid license. She remained unsure and undecided about what her life should be. Her constant and beacon was Diego, her high school sweetheart whom she married in 2019. Her daughter Arabella was born in 2022.

The thought of returning to further her education never left her. Part of Mariah's motivation spurred from the desire to improve her financial situation, to grow stability.

Mariah worried that she had waited too long and perhaps was no longer capable of meeting the academic challenges of college. Then she remembered SOL and realized she should have stayed active in the program, finished and earned her first three college credits. She remembered how

kind the staff were and how genuinely they cheered for her success. Mariah hoped she would find the same again at OCEAN.

Mariah applied for EOF for the fall of 2023, participated in our summer program, and carried her second daughter Aurora, born on November 27, 2023. Mariah's finish was magnificent, in addition to bringing new life into this world, she earned a 3.70 GPA for the semester – A's in English and Student Success; B+ in Biology and Math, and an overall GPA of 2.96.

Mariah has lessons to share as a role model for her daughters and others, growing up I didn't realize the importance of having someone, anyone, to talk to. Someone to vent to or to get advice from. Individuals who will lift you up to help you see the greatness dwelling.

I want to help others so that the issues I've survived, they can avoid. With the help of my EOF advisor, I've chosen to pursue a career in psychology. It's far from easy but every prerequisite required for these degrees, I will complete to ensure that I am that much closer to helping others in a way I couldn't before.

Getting this degree will help me to further understand the human mind and its nature, mental health awareness, coping mechanisms, and more. I'm thankful for the opportunities I have had OCEAN and EOF.

In the summer of 2022, Elizabeth realized that while she was content with her job, she wanted more out of life. Unsure where to find a clear path to a more fulfilling future, Elizabeth did her research and found Ocean County College; the only affordable college offering my degree 100% online. Elizabeth would be able to work full-time all while going to college. Intending to become a Wildlife Biologist, Liz declared an Environmental Studies major and began her college career.

It has been challenging for Elizabeth to maintain her 3.9 GPA. For her, it's all about motivation and healthy habits. That is how she avoids burning out. Remembering the bigger picture, and building a better life for myself, is my motivation. I have come too far to give up on myself! Elizabeth credits her success to understanding the importance of taking breaks and time for renewal.

One of the best decisions Elizabeth shares she made during her time at Ocean County College is applying to the Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF). She knew that to be successful she would need assistance. Having individualized advising to help guide me through college, amongst the other opportunities... made joining EOF an easy decision. In EOF, Elizabeth found community.

Though taking all online courses, Elizabeth has been able to experience much of what OCEAN offers. She attended EOF's annual Leadership Retreat and SUMMER 2023 programs. During the winter break, Elizabeth studied abroad in Italy, with OCEAN faculty and students. Liz grew her relationships beyond the digital classroom

and made new friends interested in travel. Elizabeth is also a member of the History and Dance clubs.

The biggest takeaway from her experience is that college is what you make of it. She had not intended to participate in programs or clubs. Like many students, Liz's goal was to complete her coursework and get her degree. That, however, is not the case. While she is busier, she is enjoying her college experience.

Liz did not think that college was for her. I am a first-generation college student and I have watched my parents struggle financially. She credits them for doing what they could to provide her with the best and she is truly grateful. While she feels that she owes them, Liz knows that she owes success to herself, to achieve all she can, and to break the cycle of struggle.





LEADERSHIP: SPRING BREAK 2024 JOHN WOODEN'S PYRAMID OF SUCCESS

For many spring breaks, EOF@OCEAN has hosted a leadership conference/retreat. Sometimes, we teach a theory, and other times, we focus on behaviors. Traditionally, the three-day event includes a communal living experience.

This year, we enjoyed a new venue, the Johnsonburg Retreat, founded in 1957 by the Presbyterian Church. It is a beautiful refuge of more than 300 acres of rolling hills, a large lake, and varied wildlife. Spring break 2024 focused on **John Wooden's Pyramid of Success**. Fifteen day and overnight scholars, learned about Wooden's life, his successes, and the pyramid. Activities practiced behaviors in the pyramid blocks using an experiential model.

These pictures show the activity How Well Do You Roll? It included culture teaching about Vietnamese spring rolls, or Gòi cuô'n, and practiced pyramid blocks, **Cooperation, Initiative, Team Spirit, and Skill**. Scholars divided themselves into teams, identified a lead roll who could ask questions, chose a dip, and made shrimp and tofu rolls. Afternoon pyramid skills practice included wilderness survival fire and shelter building.

It was definitely an out-of-the-comfort-zone experience for me, but I will say that I am so glad that I decided to do it because I've learned a lot of nature life-saving experiences, and I got to know people on a personal and group level.
